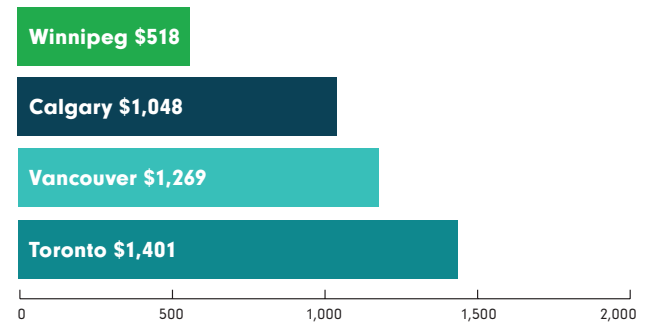

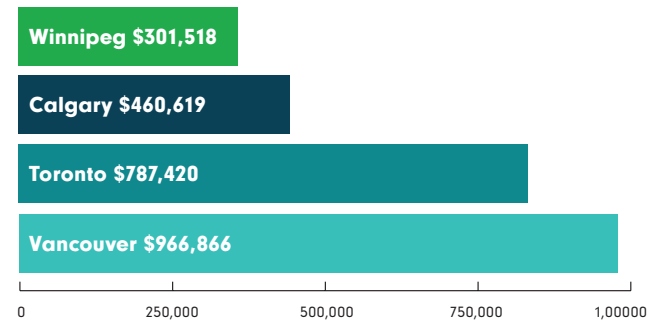

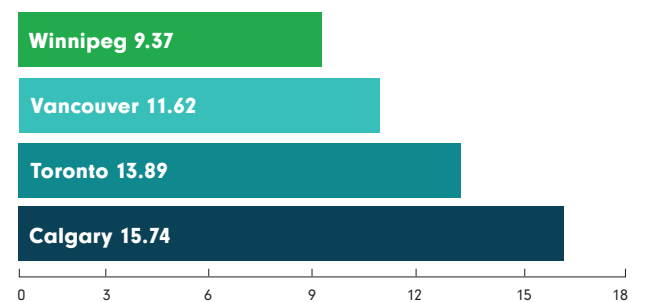
Average monthly daycare costs (\$ CDN)³
